WHY SHOULD I FILE TAXES in 2023?

- 1. Income tax credits from both current year and prior years
 - a. Earned income credit (and related NM Working Families Tax Credit)
 - b. Child tax credit
 - c. NM Child Day Care Credit up to \$480/child, maximum \$1200
 - d. Other credits American Opportunity Tax Credit, Lifetime Learning Credit, prior year COVID Stimulus Payments (Recovery Rebate Credits).
- **2. NM Low-Income Comprehensive Tax Rebate ("LICTR").** You may be eligible to receive a refund of up to \$730 for tax years <u>2021</u> and <u>2022</u>. This rebate is a refundable credit for <u>most NM residents with modified gross incomes</u> of up to \$36,000.

3. New Mexico 2022 Rebates

New Mexico residents who are not claimed as dependents on another taxpayer's return can file **2021** tax returns (Form PIT-1) through **May 31, 2023** to receive rebates. The rebates total up to \$750 for single filers and married individuals filing separately, and up to \$1500 for those with dependents or who are married and file jointly.

4. Other Reasons to file

- a. Claim refund of your "excess withholdings".
- b. You can use your filed income tax return to prove your income to social services agencies, schools and colleges.
- c. By filing, you create a record of earnings for future social security benefits.
- d. If you owe tax, but cannot pay, file anyway. There are separate IRS penalties for failure to file and failure to pay.

5. Get Free or Low Cost Tax Preparation Help from:

- c. Visit <u>GetYourRefund.org</u> If your income is \$66,000 or less, use this to get connected to IRS volunteers around the country to have your tax returns (2019-2022) prepared online or over the phone.
- d. Visit MyFreeTaxes.com If your income is \$73,000 or less, use this to prepare your own returns with help from IRS certified volunteers if/when you need help. If income \$60,000 or below, there is even more help available.
